**The William H. and Elizabeth Lynch Nolan Scholarship Fund
of the
Ross County Historical Society
Agreement**

William H. Nolan, wishing to leave a lasting legacy, established this fund to promote higher education by providing scholarships to seniors graduating from accredited high schools in Ross County.

The fund of \$75,000 is created by a bequest to the Ross County Historical Society from the estate of William H. Nolan, to be administered by the Board of Trustees of said Historical Society, a not-for-profit, 501 (C) (3) organization of the Internal Revenue Code.

The principal held in trust shall be known as the William H. and Elizabeth Lynch Nolan Scholarship Fund of the Ross County Historical Society. The number and value of the scholarships awarded annually shall be determined by the selection committee and shall depend on the amount of interest earned by the fund since the previous distribution of scholarships.

No portion of the original principal of \$75,000 may be expended for any purpose. Funds added to the original principal may be used only to increase the value of scholarships offered or to provide additional scholarships.

In order to implement the fund, the Board of Trustees of the Ross County Historical Society agree as follows:

Section I: Investment and Application of Trust Fund and Income

The Board of Trustees of the Ross County Historical Society shall hold the fund and, on the recommendation of the Treasurer and Finance Committee, shall invest it in securities which will yield the best and safest rate of return. An accounting of the investment of this fund will be included in the monthly financial reports made to the Board of Trustees, with the principal and interest clearly itemized.

Section II: Restrictions of Use of Trust Fund

The income from said fund shall be devoted exclusively to the purpose described above and shall in no part and no event be given or distributed to or inure to the benefit of any private person or corporation. In making distribution of income for the payment of scholarships, the scholarship shall not be paid directly to those students selected, but shall rather be paid directly to those institutions the students will attend.

Section III: Selection Committee

The Education Committee of the Ross County Historical Society will serve as the selection committee.

Should a relative of a member of the selection committee be among the applicants, such member shall be disqualified and shall be replaced with a qualified appointee.

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The William H. and Elizabeth Lynch Nolan Scholarship Fund of the Ross County Historical Society was established by a bequest from the estate of William H. Nolan. College scholarships will be awarded to qualifying students who are graduating seniors from accredited high schools in Ross County.

Guidelines for Application

1. Applicants must be in the top 35% of their class.
2. Applicants must be graduates of an accredited high school in Ross County.
3. Applicants must provide proof of acceptance by the college, trade or technical school of their choice.
4. Applications must be accompanied by an official high school transcript and A.C.T. (or equivalent) scores.
5. Scholarship funds are to be used for tuition, room/board, and books.
6. Scholarship payment will be made directly to the designated education institution, and not to the student.
7. Should a recipient withdraw before completing his academic year, for whatever reason, the remaining funds, in accordance with the policy of the institution, shall be returned to the Nolan Scholarship Fund.
8. The Education Committee of the Ross County Historical Society will serve as the selection committee.
9. Selection will be based on scholastic achievement, self-motivation, participation in school and community activities, financial need and any other criteria established by the selection committee.
10. In the event there is only one qualified applicant in any given year, the selection committee is not obligated to award the entire available amount to that one student.
11. Nolan Scholarships will not be distributed to recipients who receive other scholarship(s) or grant(s) that cover full tuition, room/board, and books. Recipients receiving such full-ride scholarships and/or grants must notify the Ross County Historical Society immediately. Designated educational institutions are required to return all Nolan Scholarship awards to the Ross County Historical Society in such cases.

STUDENTS MUST SUBMIT APPLICATIONS TO SCHOOL GUIDANCE COUNSELORS BY MARCH 1. GUIDANCE COUNSELORS MUST FORWARD APPLICATIONS TO THE ROSS COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY. APPLICATIONS MUST BE POSTMARKED BY THE SECOND FRIDAY IN MARCH. NO LATE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED.
