- ◆ Special display of Civil War & local historical documents by Chillicothe collector Paul Thacker.
- ◆ Exhibits of 19th century home furnishings & decorative arts.
- ◆ Special Civil War artifact & document display by the Joshua Sill Chapter, Civil War Round Table.

- ◆ One of Chillicothe's best examples of mid-19th century residential architecture and a historic landmark built in 1854.
- ◆ Exhibits on local & national African American heritage & culture include:
 - "Freedom's Journey: The Underground Railroad"
 - "African American Women in the 19th Century"
 - "The Black Church in America"



← **Adena Mansion & Gardens**

- ◆ The historic home (built 1806-07) and grounds of Thomas Worthington — Ohio's first U.S. senator, sixth governor, and "Father of Ohio Statehood."
- ◆ The inspiration for the Great Seal of Ohio.
- ◆ Guided tours of the Adena Mansion.
- ◆ Worthington & Early Statehood Museum.
- ◆ Scenic grounds, with a great view of Chillicothe.
